I. Brief Summary of Capacity Building Programme

1.1. About the University

Karnataka State Akkamahadevi Women's University (formerly known as Karnataka State Women's University) established in 2003 in the city of Vijayapura (Formerly Bijapura), is the only Women's University in Karnataka dedicated exclusively for Women's Education. It is recognized under 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act. It has been accredited 'B' grade by NAAC. The university is also a recent recipient of **Four Stars as per KSURF** rankings. 163 women's colleges of Karnataka, are affiliated to this University and one P G Center at Sindhanoor, Udatadi and Bangalore and one Extension center at Mandya are offering various Programmes. The University offers various UG Programmes leading to Bachelor's degree in Arts, Business Administration, Computer Application, Commerce, Education, Fashion Technology, Home Science, Physical Education, Science and Social Work It also offers 32 P G Courses, PG Diploma and Certificate Courses in the Faculties of Arts, Commerce and Management, Social Sciences, Science & Technology and Education.

1.2 About the Department

The Department of Economics is one of the pioneering departments in Social Sciences. The Department has been progressing consistently in the field of teaching, research and extension activities in the field of Economics. While some leading world class institutions like the IITs and the IIMs are achieving what was well planned in their objectives, others portray a dismal picture in terms of quality and quantity of research. The Indian system of higher education has been facing a number of challenges. There are four things required for quality research namely subject acquaintance, statistics, research methodology and technology (software). In majority cases of Indian context, it has been observed that researchers are having excellent subject knowledge but lack of scientific knowledge and training in Research Methodology and technology adoption, which has been considered as one of the main impediments in producing quality researchers. Many of our researchers and guides are themselves not found competent enough to carry out sound empirical work due to lack of advanced statistical knowledge. Thus, it requires major investments so as to make human resources productive, by coupling the older general disciplines (of Humanities, Social Sciences, Natural Sciences, and Commerce) with their applications in new economy and having adequate field base experience, for enhancing knowledge with skills and developing appropriate attitudes.

1.4 About the Course

Research methodology is a structured framework of conducting research in order to address various issues to solve problems in a scientific manner. For a high quality research, one requires to collect, interpret and logically document the information. Selection of an appropriate tool for data analysis and its meaningful interpretation will be a difficult task without proper understanding of theoretical concepts of research methodology and analytical methods. Quantitative and qualitative data analysis using contemporary statistical techniques for conducting research for better decision making is necessary. Knowledge of applied research tools and methodology along with the use of software helps in integrating research and practice. Good publications require more in-depth research with sound analysis of data. SPSS hands-on training certainly enhances the possibility of greater research and publication skills of all those engaged in data analysis and research activities. So, the proposed 14-day CBP will provide platform to train the participants on innovative business

and industry research methods, data analysis using SPSS and academic writing skills through interactive and practical sessions.

Enrichment is the action of improving or enhancing the quality or value. Based on this concept, the program has been designed for developing the new generation teachers in the discipline of Commerce, Management, Psychology, Sociology, Economics, Agriculture, Education, Geography and other branches of Social Science. The program is aimed at improving the research orientation of Newly appointed various University or Aided Institutions faculty members by providing an interactive platform to enhance the understanding of advanced statistical techniques as well as providing hands-on training for analyzing data using alternative software for statistical analysis. The course is based on the theoretical lectures and practical exercise on advanced contemporary software. This program will follow problem based approach, i.e., participants will be made familiar with the theory first and then they will be using contemporary software using examples, so that they may gain confidence and expertise in conducting researches in their respective subject domains.

1.5 Significance of the Course

This Two week Research Methodology Course in Social Science Research is an integral part of the growth and expansion of social sciences. Its importance is enhanced much more in the modern, globalized society where development has attained additional dimensions. Social Science Research faces the challenge to thoroughly equip itself to meet the ever growing needs of the society that is transforming at a rapid pace. Often, demarcations (into rural, urban and cast, gender etc) are blurred by the advancement in technology and changing socio-economic scenario. Societal problems are assuming wide-ranging complexities. Under these circumstances, it is necessary to approach research from a preliminary and systematic understanding of the methods in social science research is an essential part of social science research and over a period of time, the methods have expanded enormously in their scope and application.

The key idea behind the program is to enrich the capability of conducting quality research among Young **Social Science Faculty** members of social sciences and further bring out research output into publishable material of high quality in the form of journal articles or books.

1.6 Target Group and Seats:

Young Faculty of Social Science Disciplines who are working there from University /Deemed University/ Departments, affiliated Colleges and Research Institutions located from the city (10) Seats ,States from (10) and out of the state from (10),seats can join the Programme. The maximum number of seats is 30.The present training programme aims to develop research capabilities among young faculty to turn completed research into publishable material in the form of articles/books by providing a general understanding of the nature and relevance of the research methods. It introduces participants to the essential principles, techniques and processes of qualitative and quantitative research. In doing so, it deals with various theoretical and methodological issues involved in such inquiry as well as the strategies and techniques such as research design, methods of qualitative data collection, coding and analysis involved in empirical Field research.

1.7 Specific Objectives of the Programme:

- 1 To maintain and enhance faculty effectiveness and further expert instruction and guidance to their students.
- 2 To create awareness about modern teaching practices and research methodologies.
- 3 To enhance skills to work with advanced software packages for analyzing data using alternative software.
- 4 To develop capacity for writing research paper, article and book through advanced writing software.

He has addressed on the topic of **Data Collection Primary and Secondary** and he was focused on There are main two sources: --- primary and secondary source, A primary source is one that itself collect the data. For example, the data collected by the ministry of industries and made available through various publications constitute primary source.



Secondary Sources: A secondary source is one that makes available data which were collected by some other agency. He also highlighted on the **Methods of collecting primary data:** there is a face-to-face contact with the persons from whom the information is to be obtained. The information obtained is first hand or original in character.

❖ **Merits of this method:**

- 1 Response is more encouraging.
- 2 The data collect is more accurate.
- 3 It is possible to collect supplementary information.
- 4 Delicate situation can usually be handled more effectively by this method.
- 5 The language of communication can be adopted to suit the requirement of the status and level of the respondents.

❖ **Demerits of this method:**

- 1 It may be very costly.
- 2 Personal prejudice and bias may enter. The data collected may not be unbiased.
- 3 A trained person is required to cover on the interview.
- 4 More time is required.

❖ **Suitability:** This method is suitable for intensive rather than extensive field surveys.

First session was ended at 12pm.

After completion of 1st session there was tea break and then continued 2nd session was continued by Dr.B.Nagoor he on **Field Research** he has emphasized on how to conduct field research, what are the methods of field research and also talked about why field research is important etc. has given a lot of knowledge regarding field research.

3.3 Summary of Presentation Day 3 (16th March, 2021)

Bagalakotehe**, Professor of Economics Karnataka University, Dharwad. He has addressed on the topic of **Analysis of Quantitative & Qualitative Data**.



He has highlighted very crucial points like Nature of Data may be: Quantitative (or numerical) data is an expression of a property or quality in numerical terms Data measured and expressed in quantity. It enables (i) precise measurement (ii) knowing trends or changes over time, and (iii) comparison of trends or individual units

On the other hand Qualitative (or categorical) data involves quality or kind with subjectivity *Variables data* are quality characteristics that are measurable values, i.e., they are measurable, normally continuous and may take on any value. *Attribute data* are quality characteristics that are observed to be either present or absent, conforming or not conforming, i.e., they are countable, normally discrete and integer. Then he also shown us the Processing and Analysis of Qualitative Data When feel & flavor of the situation become important, researchers resort to qualitative data (sometimes called attribute data). Qualitative data describe attributes of a single or a group of persons that is important to record as

accurately as possible even though they cannot be measured in quantitative terms. More time & efforts are needed to collect & process qualitative data. Such data are not amenable for statistical rules & manipulations. However, scaling techniques help converting qualitative data into quantitative data. Usual data reduction, synthesis and plotting trends are required but differ substantially and extrapolation of finding is difficult. It calls for sensitive interpretation & creative presentation. Examples: Quotation from interview, open remarks in questionnaire, case histories bringing evidence, content analysis of verbatim material, etc.

And so there was tea break then 2nd session was continued by **Dr. S.T. Bagalakotehe** on the topic of **Using of SPSS and PRA/RRA/PLA**. He has discussed on the Brief concept of Statistical Software. There are many software packages to perform statistical analysis and visualization of data. Some of them are-System for Statistical Analysis (SAS), S-plus, R, Matlab, Minitab, BMDP, STATA, SPSS, StatXact, Statistica, LISREL, JMP, GLIM, HIL, MS Excel etc. He has also focused on Microsoft Excel. There are many versions of MS-Excel and are capable of performing a number of statistical analyses.

 - An empirical Production function

- Inferential statistical techniques are the techniques which are used to draw conclusions about a population by testing the data taken from the sample of that population.
- It is a process of generalization from sample to population. It focuses on making statement about the population.
- It includes both hypothesis testing & deriving estimates.

He has also highlighted on Concept of Hypothesis Testing and Formulation of Hypothesis.

And Key Points in Drawing Inference

- Sample units must be a good representative of Population to draw inference.
- Random sampling which gives equal chance of being selected to each unit of population is the best sampling method.
- Calculate the statistics which describe the characteristics of sample group
- Conclusion on parameter which describe the characteristics of population
- Sampling distributions (tables based on probability) to make inference
- Confidence Level: What is the degree of accuracy needed 99% of 95%. Select the level of significance
- Confidence Interval: A calculated range for the true value



After 2nd session there was lunch break for half an hour from 1:45pm to 2:30pm straight off the 3rd session was followed with the felicitation to **Dr. Gavisiddappa Anandhalli** , is Associate Professor and (I/C) Librarian Dept. of Library and Information Science KSAWU, Vijayapura.
